RESOLUTION NO. 29-06

WHEREAS, the SculptureWalk program of the Sioux Empire Arts Council will bring a large number of sculptures to the central business district for outdoor display;

WHEREAS, the SculptureWalk program enhances the beauty and culture of the downtown area for all citizens and visitors to enjoy;

WHEREAS, 65 of the proposed sculptures will be placed on public right-of-way or other publicly-owned property;

WHEREAS, the exhibition of public art in the central business district is recommended and encouraged by the Final Report of the Downtown Art Committee (DART), the City of Sioux Falls' 2015 Downtown Plan, and the Sioux Empire Arts Council's Sioux Empire Cultural Plan;

WHEREAS, the SculptureWalk program represents a broad collaboration of individuals and entities, both public and private, including Main Street Sioux Falls, the Sioux Empire Arts Council, the Chamber of Commerce, and the City of Sioux Falls; and

WHEREAS, the Sioux Falls Visual Arts Commission has reviewed the proposed sculptures and their placements, and has recommended the proposed placements be approved by the City Council;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF SIOUX FALLS, SD:

That it approves the placement in public right-of-way and on public property of 54 sculptures, as described by the following:

"Hungry Bears" – On northwest corner of 11th Street and Phillips Avenue in front of Great Outdoor Store.

"Onus Probandi" – On west side of Phillips Avenue in front of The Book Shop.

"Going for the Goal" – On west side of Phillips Avenue in front of Mrs. Murphy's Irish Gifts.

"Wubbe XYZ" – On west side of Phillips Avenue in front of Prairie Star Gallery.

“A Book for Everyone” – On southwest corner of Tenth Street and Phillips Avenue facing intersection.

“News!” – On northwest corner of Tenth Street and Phillips Avenue.

“The Potato Man” – On west side of Phillips Avenue south of the Diner.

“Whirling Leaves” – On the west side of Phillips Avenue suspended from light pole overlooking the fountain in Fountain Plaza.

“Mountain Queen” – On the west side of Phillips Avenue in landscaping on southwest side of the fountain in Fountain Plaza.

“Garden” – On the west side of Phillips Avenue, on north side of fountain in Fountain Plaza.

“Horse of the Plains” – On the west side of Phillips Avenue in front of CNA.

“The Reality Assumption” – On southwest corner of Ninth Street and Phillips Avenue in front of CNA.

“Inspiration” – On northwest corner of Ninth Street and Phillips Avenue in front of Wells Fargo Bank.

“For Which It Stands” – On northwest corner of Ninth Street and Phillips Avenue, looking up at U.S. flag.

“Crescents” – On southwest corner of Eighth Street and Phillips Avenue.

“Klompenboot 6” – On northwest corner of Eighth Street and Phillips Avenue.

“The Swan Princess” – On east side of Phillips Avenue, on the south side of Van Brunt Building, facing south.

“Deer” – On northeast corner of Ninth Street and Phillips Avenue in Security Bank planter or around the corner to the east on Ninth Street.

“For-ever Ready” – On the north side of East Eighth Street in front of the renovated Crane Building leaping across fence.

“Aqueduct II” – At the southeast corner of Eighth Street and Reid Avenue in front of 8th & Railroad Center.

“Stone Boat Bench” – On southeast corner of Eighth Street and Phillips Avenue near horse fountain.

“Tale of Respect” – On east side of Phillips Avenue in front of 1st National Bank.

“Love of a Child” – On the east side of Phillips Avenue in front of First Financial near
“Raven” Mosaic.

“Raven” – On the east side of Phillips Avenue in front of First Financial Center.

“Paus de deux” – On east side of Phillips Avenue across from Fountain Plaza.

“Hans Christian Andersen” – On east side of Phillips Avenue in front Holsen Hus next to
“Paus de deux.”

“The Civil Engineer” – On northeast corner of Tenth Street and Phillips Avenue, facing
intersection.

“Stargazer” – On grass island in middle of street at Tenth Street and Second Avenue.

“Awakening” – On south side of Tenth Street on east side of Depot Building, facing
traffic.

“Guardian” – On the southwest corner of Tenth Street and Phillips Avenue against the
north wall, facing north.

“Honor” – On southeast corner of Tenth Street and Phillips Avenue in front of De Hoek
Store, facing intersection.

“Passing It Along” – On east side of Phillips Avenue in front of Rehfeld’s Gallery.

“Rocky Mountain Tag” – On east side of Phillips Avenue in front of Susanne’s.

“Kid’s Turtle” – On the east side of Phillips Avenue in front of the AAA Travel.

“Morning Spirits” – On northeast corner of 11th Street and Phillips Avenue in front of
Shriver Square.

“Victory” – On southeast corner of 11th Street and Phillips Avenue facing west.

“Spinning Moon Dancing” – On the east side of Phillips Avenue in front of Dacotah
Bank.

“Summer Distractions” – On the east side of Phillips Avenue in front of the State
Theater.

“Mommy, Mommy, Daddy’s Home” – On the east side of Phillips Avenue in front of
Coffee-n-Clay.

“Fancy Dancer” – On northeast corner of 12th Street and Phillips Avenue (Courthouse Plaza) in front of Café 334.

“Katie & Johnny” – On the north side of the Courthouse Plaza in landscaping.

“Marcie’s Garden” – On the southeast corner of 12th Street and Phillips Avenue in front of Federal Building.

“Einstein” – On northeast corner of 13th Street and Phillips Avenue facing south at traffic entering downtown.

“Like a Tree Rooted in the Earth” – On east side of Phillips Avenue in front of KELO TV.

“Neon” – On northwest corner of 13th Street and Phillips Avenue near Sushi Massa.

“Heavy Thinker” – On southwest corner of 12th Street and Phillips Avenue.

“Ojibwa River” – On northwest corner of 12th Street and Phillips Avenue in front of Touch of Europe.

“When I was 4, 3 Generations Ago” – On the west side of Phillips in front of Bead Store.

“The Farm Wife” – On Phillips Avenue in front of Paramount Studio.

“Youth Sculpture” – On the north side of the Horse Barn Arts Center in Falls Park.

“Shepherd” – In Falls Park West at intersection of two sidewalks.

“Raven Augury” – Best of Show 2005 purchased by Raven Industries and donated to the City south of Sixth Street on bike trail across river from Raven Industries.

“Two Eagles” – Purchased by Jeff Savage and donated to the City on east side of Horse Barn Arts Center near river in Falls Park.

“Steele Family” – Artist donation to SculptureWalk in Skywalk between Shriver Square—Dacotah Bank near west windows.
