Pedestrian Plan –

Policies:

All streets should have sidewalks to allow pedestrians to travel between neighborhoods, access destinations, and access transit stops. Sidewalks are expected on both sides of an arterial urban section street.

Work with the developers to increase pedestrian connectivity within subdivisions and between subdivisions consistent with the City's subdivision ordinance [Subdivision Ordinance 156.099 (Preliminary Plan Walkway) and 157.114 (Walkways)].

Encourage development of sidewalks and private trails within developments with private streets to ensure convenient connections for residents.

Shared Use Path – draft ordinance amendment / standard.

The proposed change is in the wording; we are now calling walks, walkways, trails --- shared use paths.

Existing requirement states sidewalks shall be 6' within 10' easement; proposal states shared use path – walkway needs to be 6' within 10' easement.

Existing requirement states trails shall be dedicated within an easement; proposal states shared use path – trail needs to be 12' within a 20' easement.

- Maybe more importantly, we have designed an exhibit to hand to developers / contractors regarding the standards for a shared use path – trail.

Went to Infrastructure Review Advisory Board on April 12; there were no questions or concerns.

It will be going forward to Planning Commission on May 5.
