## What are school-based health clinics?

School-based health clinics work to improve the health of students, increase access to healthcare, and decrease time lost from the classroom. It is a significant part of our organization's outreach so that our youth stay healthy and ready to learn.

# Who is eligible for clinic services?

All students at Hayward, Hawthorne, and Terry Redlin Elementary. Staff and community are welcome at these locations as well.

### What services can be provided?

- Routine physical exams—including sports physicals.
- Diagnosis and treatment of illness and minor injuries.
- Vision, dental, and blood pressure screenings.
- $\circ$  Immunizations.
- Health and nutrition education and counseling.

- Medical and mental health management of chronic conditions such as diabetes, asthma, ADHD, etc.
- Behavioral health services including screening, assessment, and medication management.
- Dental services—exam, X-rays, fluoride, sealants, and cleaning.

## Can the school clinic provider serve as my primary provider?

<u>Yes!</u> The medical and dental providers working in the school clinics are well trained and able to serve as your medical and dental home.

# What are the payment options?

FCH accepts most insurance including Medicaid and Medicare. We also offer a sliding fee discount based on your family size and income. Contact our billing department at 367-8770 for more details.

### Will signing up mean that we can't use our family doctor or dentist?

Our school-based health center is not meant to replace your child's provider or dentist. However, you can still use our services even if you have a provider. You may find it's convenient for your child to receive care right at the school if they get sick or injured at school. The school and our clinic work as a team to help children avoid missing school and manage care.

# Can I choose whether my child will receive services?

<u>Yes.</u> The clinic will contact you prior to any treatment your child receives. You can be present at the time of the visit, but it is not required.

### Will my child's information be kept confidential?

<u>Yes.</u> By signing the consent form, you give the health clinic staff and school nurse permission to communicate and share medical information regarding your child's medical condition on a needed basis with the understanding that this information will be treated in a confidential manner.
